Mechanisms Of Privatization In Health System Of Selected Countries And Planning A Model For Iran

ABSTRACT

Background and Objectives: Minimizing public sector and privatization policy causes the health sector policy makers are being asked to introduce best mechanisms and forms of reforms to meet the objectives of equity, quality, efficiency and productivity. The main objective of this research was Survey in privatization through the world and planning a model for Iran.

Materials and Methods: In the comparative present research, mechanisms of privatization in England, Turkey, Zambia, Ghana, Mexico, Thailand, France, Chile, Sweden and Philippines was reviewed in order to prepare an appropriate module for Iranian health system.

The valid mechanisms proposed in a model for Iran in the form of questioner using Delphi techniques, that was distributed among informant and experts such as health management professors, head of medical universities and ministries of MOH and vice chancellors of them (N=65).

Results: Analysis of 35 collected questioners indicated that all participated subjects agreed with appropriate Mentioned developed module. Statically the module was also confirmed the significant of results (z=3.54, p value<0/05).

Conclusion: Constituents of the module are:

To form health corporations and enforcing to competition ,integrating public and private units with boards of trusts ,structuring contracting and delegating to non-public sector and constitute of national accreditation committee.
